



July is National Hot Dog, Ice Cream, and Blueberry Month!




July 4, 1776

The Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress




July 16, 1945

2020 2021 Summer Olympics

The Summer Olympics are scheduled to kick off July 23 through August 8 in Tokyo, Japan, after a year's delay due to the coronavirus pandemic. Team USA is looking strong, fast, and just GREAT. The U.S. has won the most medals at every Summer Games since 1996, and its more than 500 athletes will try to keep that trend going. Here are some key athletes that we hope will bring home the Gold!

Swimming (Women) – Katie Ledecky – This will be Ledecky's third Olympic games. The Maryland native, who joined her first swim team at age 6, already has earned five gold medals and a silver. She also holds the world record in six freestyle events.

Swimming (Men) – Caeleb Dressel – This Florida native holds part of nine world records. Seven are with relay teams and two his own: 100-meter butterfly and 50-meter freestyle. Caeleb took home a record eight medals at the 2019 World Aquatics Championships, breaking the record of Michael Phelps.

Gymnastics – Simone Biles – Biles already has 30 Olympic and world-champion medals. The Columbus, OH, native is the current world champion and is the most decorated gymnast in the world.

Surfing – Kolohe Andino – the son of a surfing champ, Andino spent his childhood traveling the world, splashing in the best waves, while watching the globe's best surfers at work. His nine National Scholastic Surfing Association championships are the most ever.

Track and Field (Women) – Sydney McLaughlin - this 21 year old has never lost a race while in high school, earning her the title of Gatorade National Girls Athlete of the Year in 2016 and 2017. Watch her run like the wind in the 400-meter hurdles.

Track and Field (Men) – Noah Lyles – Noah had such severe asthma as a child that sometimes he needed to be hooked up to a breathing machine. He was also bullied in school due to ADD. Now he's one of the fastest people in the worlds, winning gold in the 200-meter run and 4x100-meter relay at the 2019 world championships. He also holds the world record in the 300-meter run.

Wrestling – Helen Maroulis – Helen began her wrestling career at age 7 when her brother needed a practice partner. Now she is the reigning women's Olympic gold medalist, the first in American history. In 2018, at a match in India, she suffered a concussion, leading to a post-traumatic stress disorder. She has worked hard to overcome this disorder and "go for the gold" once again.

Fun Fact!

There are four medal events new to the Summer Olympics: karate, skateboarding, surfing, and sport climbing. Baseball and softball are also back on the score sheet for the first time since 2008.






