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# **Grace Kudukis**



Grace Knistautas was born on January 22, 1941, in Lithuania. Both of her parents were pilots in the Air Force. In fact, her mother was one of the first women pilots. When Grace was two years old, at the height of WWII, she and her mother fled Lithuania and escaped to Germany. Being pilots, Grace's parents would have been one of the first families to be annihilated in Lithuania. Her father stayed on as a pilot for a bit longer, then joined his family in Germany. The family remained in Germany for five years (Grace's brother was born during this time), then chose to relocate to Australia. At that time, ethnics living in Germany didn't have many choices on where to live; Australia, America, New Zealand, and New Guinea were among the countries that would accept them. The waiting period for America was too long, so they chose Australia, where they remained for 11 years. After receiving their immigration papers, they moved to America in 1960, choosing the industrial city of Cleveland, with many factory jobs available for immigrants. Grace met her future husband, Raymond Kudukis, through mutual friends. Ray just happened to be Lithuanian, which was not important to Grace at the time, but ultimately broadened her outlook, and kept the two active in the Lithuanian communities. Grace worked as a receptionist at an engineering firm for about a year before she and Ray married, settling in the Cleveland suburb of Euclid. Ray was an engineer and owned his own company, however, he was Utilities Director for the City of Cleveland during the Ralph Perk administration. Ray was a founding member of the Lithuanian American Citizens Club, and vice-president

of the World Lithuanian Community. It was around this time that Grace began her illustrious career in volunteerism, beginning as a secretary for the Great Lakes Shakespeare Festival, as president of the League of Women Voters, which she was an active member for majority of her years. Grace was on the board of the Nationalities Services Center and the community representative with the Grievance court of the Cleveland Metropolitan Housing Authority. She served on the women's committee of the Cleveland Orchestra, the board for American Civil Liberties, and on the executive committee for the Republican party. Grace was heavily involved in the political activities in America, especially during the Reagan administration. She was the main organizer/coordinator of many presidential debates. Oh, and in her spare time, Grace was a Girl Scout leader for her daughter's troop. At one point, Grace did work fulltime, as the president of Belkin Kudukis Film Production Services, with the purpose to interest the filmmakers of Hollywood in Cleveland as a site for movie making. Not sure how, but life has quieted down a bit for Grace, moving to Kensington at Anna Maria in October of 2021 after a brief stay in the hospital. She enjoys the many fun activities, and is thankful to participate in rosary and communion. Grace has made many friends, and is a delight to all who cross her path. Words of wisdom from Grace? Please consider how fortunate you are to live in this wonderful country of America. Love and respect the freedom in which you live. May God continue to bless Grace Kudukis with good health and happiness always.

## **S** Recipes:

### **Broccoli Cheese Soup (Colleen Storme)**

#### Ingredients:

#### Instructions:

stick of butter
 large onion
 cups chicken broth
 potatoes
 head of broccoli
 celery stalks
 2-4 carrots

Saute one (1) stick of butter with a large chopped onion. Add 4 T. of flour, stir.

In another pot – Pour in six (6) cups of chicken broth and add: 4 potatoes, cubed One head of broccoli, chopped 4 celery stalks, chopped 3-4 carrots, chopped

Cook over medium heat until vegetables are tender. Add onion/ flour mixture and 2 cups of milk or half and half. Add 1 lb of cubed Velveeta cheese. Cook (but do not boil) until thoroughly combined and smooth

### Cream of Broccoli Soup (Carolyn Cannon)

#### **Ingredients:**

2 T. butter 1 cup chopped onion 1/2 cup chopped celery 1 cup chicken stock or broth 2 pounds frozen cut broccoli 1 pint whole milk 1 pint heavy cream 1/2 stick butter 2 bay leaves Dash of Hot sauce 6 slices Canadian bacon, sliced into thin strips 2 T all-purpose flour 1/2 cup pepperjack cheese Salt and pepper to taste

#### **Instructions:**

Heat butter in a large pot. Add onion and celery, saute until wilted. Add chicken stock and bring to a boil, add the broccoli. Cover and simmer for about 15 minutes. When broccoli is tender, remove half of it and set aside. Add the milk, cream, and 1/2 stick of butter. Stir constantly until bubbly. Reduce heat. Stir in bay leaves, hot sauce, bacon, flour and cheese. When blended, put lid back on and simmer for 45 minutes. Season to taste with salt and pepper and add the reserved broccoli.



### Zuppa Tuscana (Ashley Hamilton)

#### **Ingredients:**

6 oz. bacon bits 1 lb hot Italian sausage 10 large cloves of garlic, peeled and minced 1 medium onion, finely diced 4 cups chicken broth/stock (32 oz) 6 cups of water (48 oz) 5 medium Russet potatoes, peeled and chopped into 1/4" thick pieces 1 bundle of kale, leaves stripped and chopped 1 cup whipping cream

#### Instructions:

In a large pot, saute bacon in oil until browned, about 5-7 minutes. Remove to a paper-towel lined plate - spoon out excess oil, leaving about 1 T. in pan. Add sausage and brown, breaking up as it cooks, until no longer pink. Remove to a paper-towel lined plate. Add onion saute about 5 minutes; add garlic and saute another minute. Add chicken broth and water, bring to a boil. Add potatoes and cook over medium heat, about 14 minutes, or until potatoes are soft. Add kale and sausage, bring to a light boil. Fold in whipping cream bring back to a boil. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add bacon. Garnish with parmesan cheese if desired.

### **Chicken Vegetable Soup (Amy Powers)**

#### **Ingredients:**

sauce

1/2 of a large jar of Prego spaghetti 2-3 chicken cooked and shredded chicken  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a can of corn Can of green beans

Poultry seasoning, salt, pepper, and garlic powder to taste

#### **Instructions:**

Place all ingredients in a Crockpot with some water. Add more spaghetti sauce if needed. Cook on low for about 2 hours.


