## Debbie Carr's Favorite Fall Recipe:

### Chocolate Chip Pumpkin Muffins

Debbie Carr (LPN, MDS at Anna Maria) loves this time of year! She enjoys baking and is happy to share one of her favorite pumpkin recipes! Enjoy!



#### Preheat Oven to 375 degrees

2 cups all-purpose flour  
 2 ½ t. baking powder  
 1 t. ginger  
 1 t. ground cinnamon  
 ¾ t. salt  
 ¼ t. baking soda  
 Dash of ground allspice  
 1 large egg, room temperature  
 ¾ cup packed brown sugar  
 ¾ cup canned pumpkin  
 ⅔ cup milk  
 3 T. melted butter  
 1 t. vanilla extract  
 ½ cup mini semisweet chocolate chips



In a bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. In a separate bowl, combine the egg, brown sugar, pumpkin, milk, butter and vanilla; stir into dry ingredients until moistened. Stir in chips.

Fill 12 paper-lined muffin cups ¾ full. Bake for 18-22 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pan to wire rack.


## OWL You Need is LOVE




### Congratulations to Bowie!





## Things That Go BUMP in the Night...

What images come to mind when you think of Halloween? Probably pumpkins, witches, ghosts, black cats, and—of course—bats! Bats are one of the spookiest and most enduring images of Halloween, but how did the image of this harmless and beneficial flier become a feared sign of darkness and evil? The black, winged shapes flying through the dusky night sky are eternally linked to Halloween. No need to fear the bat; here's why.... Over 300 species of fruit depend upon bats for pollination. Bats help spread seeds for nuts, figs, and cacao (the main ingredient in chocolate). Each night, bats can eat their body weight or more in insects numbering in the thousands. In fact, a single bat can consume more than 600 bugs in an hour. Favorite insect? The mosquito! Bats are true friends of the farmer! Of course, the vampire bat gets a bad rap, however, of the 1,100 species of bats, only three are vampire bats, residing in Central and South Americas. The state of Texas is home to the largest bat colony on the planet. Bracken Cave in San Antonio, TX, is home to approximately 20 million Mexican free-tailed bats. Quite a sight to see millions of bats emerging from the cave each evening – emergences can last more than three hours! Another bat colony resides in the crevices under the Congress Avenue Bridge in Austin, TX. This roost attracts hundreds of spectators nightly. Unfortunately, a fungal disease called white-nose syndrome has wiped out the majority of the bat colonies in the Northeast, including the popular Canoe Creek State Park in Pennsylvania.


